

Judges decision is final.

Good manners and behaviour are expected at all times by all. Stewards have the right to disqualify offenders. The Show Committee is not responsible for any loss, damage or injury whatsoever. Hats must be worn and secure at all times when mounted and must be to the current British standard or PAS accredited. No spurs to be worn by child 16 years or under, No whips or spurs to be worn in games, No excessive use of whips. Riders competing in lead rein classes in each section, e.g. riding classes, are not eligible for non-lead rein classes.

Flu Vaccinations

Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

Industrial Section Rules

- 1. All articles for competition to be staged by 10am and remain until 4pm
- 2. The committee is not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits, but all possible care will be taken
- 3. All work to be produced by the exhibitor excepting the 'pick up and bring' (class 45)
- 4. Any article which has already won first prize at this society is prohibited
- 5. Only two entries per person, per class
- 6. Prize money will be paid out between 3.30pm and 4.30pm in the industrial marquee
- 7. Points to be awarded: 1st 3pts, 2nd 2pts, 3rd 1pt throughout
- 8. Cups and/or special prizes will be awarded for most points in certain classes
- 9. Exhibits not removed by 5pm are left at the owners risk

Allendale Agricultural Society and its officers shall not be responsible for any person whatsoever while upon the Society's premises, or while entering or leaving the same, for any damage or loss however caused to the property of any such person or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any person. The Society and its officials shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant or to any animal, article or property exhibited or brought onto the showground by him. Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses or claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury however caused.

Rules of competitions and regulations

The Society's District comprises of the Parishes of Allendale, West Allen, Whitfield, High and Middle Quarters of Hexhamshire, and the following farms in Haydon Bridge, vis: Stublick Bog, Stublick Hill and Branch End, Langley Castle, High Staward, Carts Bog, Nilston Rigg, Langley Hill Top, East and West Dean Raw, Silly Wreas (2), Lough Green, Harlow Field, Harsondale, Plankey Mill, Paise, East and West Greenridge, Nubbock, Threepwood and Elrington.

- No alteration to these rules can be made unless carries by two thirds majority of those present at the Annual Meeting.
- 2. The financial year of the Society ends January 31st.
- 3. Collector's books to be handed to the secretary within 48 days of the show ending.
- 4. The annual minimum subscription of £5 constitutes a member of the Society and entitles him/her to free admission to the Show field, to the privilege of attending and voting at the AGM and of being eligible to be elected on the committee.
- 5. The competition for stock is unlimited, except where special reservation is made.
- 6. All animals competing for the Society's premium to be bon-fide the property of the exhibitor ad shall have been his property three months immediately previous to the show, which must be proved to the satisfaction of the committee, or must be kept by him three months after the show.
- In no case shall a premium be awarded unless the judges deem the stock of sufficient merit and where there is only one exhibit in any class, only the second prize will be paid.
- The committee and stewards have full power to prevent any animal entering the ring which have been entered contrary to the rules of the society.
- 9. All premiums advertised in this schedule shall be subject to the rules of the society and any dispute arising shall be settled by the committee whose decision shall be final. Any person lodging an objection must do so in writing within a week from the date of the show and deposit £1 with the secretary which will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.
- All stock must be on the ground not later than 9.30am. Ridden ponies start 8.30am, show jumping starts 11am, mounted games to follow.
- 11. Any competitor having at any time been found to have infringed any of the above rules or regulations of the society as hereinafter set forth in the schedule shall forfeit all prizes they man have been awarded on the show day and shall be debarred from exhibiting any stock at any future show of the society for a period of four years.
- The society shall not be responsible for any accident or injury or loss which may happen to any person, animal or implement on the showground.
- 13. Prize money will be paid out on the day of the show.
- 14. All entry forms must be accompanied by entry fees.
